You need to write a note card with accurate reference information (this means you need at least four note cards). The note cards will be part of your grade. For full points, please follow the below format for the note cards.

Books

Source#

Author or editor (last name first). Title (underlined). City where the book was published: Publisher, copyright date.

Ex: Miles, Michael C. Hurricane Force. Philadelphia: Countryside Press, 2002.

Magazines

Source#

Author (last name first). Article title (in quotation marks). Title of the magazine (underlined) Date (day, month, year): Page numbers of the article.

Ex: Tucker, Libby. "Now That's Intense!" Science World 17 Nov. 2003: 4-6.

Internet

Source#

Author (if available). Page title (if available, in quotation marks). site title (underlined). Name of sponsor (if available). Date published (if available). Date found <electronic address>.

Ex: Skelton, Renee. "Flying into the Eye of the Hurricane." National Geographic Kids. National Geographic. 12 Mar. 2004 <<http://nationalgeographic.com/ngkids/0308/hurricane/>>.

Encyclopedia

Source#

Author (if available). Article title (in quotation marks). Title of the encyclopedia (underlined). Edition (if available). Date published.

Ex: "Hurricane." World Almanac for Kids. 2004.

Interview

Source#

Person Interviewed (last name first). Type of interview (personal, phone, e-mail). Date.

Ex: Rasmussen, Arnold. Personal Interview. 13 Mar. 2004.
